Silver Guide: 29 Required Credits for Graduation

English	5	English 9 (2 credits), English 10, English 11 or AP Seminar and English 12 or AP Literature
Math	4	See Math Flow Chart
Science	4	Environmental Science, Biology, Chemistry, one additional science
Social Studies	4	US History II, Modern World, Modern World II, and Civics, US Gov't or CSSS
World Language	3	Levels 1-4 plus AP if a student chooses (one credit from MS counts toward distribution)
Fine/Applied Arts, Business, CompSci	3	See <u>Summary of Elective Options</u>
Health/PE	2	H/PE 1 (9th grade), H/PE 2 (10th grade)
Other Credits	4	Can be a combination of elective, academic, technical school, co-op, field career or non-SHHS courses

Sample: Courses to Meet Graduation Requirements

Grade Level	Minimum Requirement: 8 credits per year	
9th Grade	English (2 credit), Math, Social Studies, Science, Health/PE, World Language, and one additional course/elective	
10th Grade	English, Math, Social Studies, Science, Health/PE, World Language and two additional courses/electives	
11th Grade	English, Math, Social Studies, Science, World Language*, and three additional courses/electives	
12th Grade	English, Math, Social Studies, Science, World Language*, and four additional courses/electives	

Silver Guide: Additional Pennsylvania Requirements

Students must demonstrate PROFICIENCY on Keystone Exams in Algebra, Biology, and Literature.

Beginning with the Class of 2023, students who do not meet the proficiency requirement will need to access <u>Alternative Pathways</u> to Graduation. Counselors will support students who must complete an Alternative Pathway.

Silver Guide: Credits Clarification

No courses taken prior to ninth grade will be reflected on the high school transcript or in the high school grade point average.

Students may make one academic substitution for their Arts, Business or Computer Science distribution requirement.

Students who take a level one language at the MS may apply one credit toward distribution at the HS as long as the same language continues at the HS. The MS credit and grade are not applied to the transcript.

Students in their 11th or 12th grade year may enroll in up to two (2) credits in the areas of Independent Study, college courses, accredited online courses, Field Career or Cooperative Education. **These may not replace required core courses.**

Course Registration: Prerequisites

Some courses have prerequisites or grade level requirements. Teachers and school counselors cannot override or waive these course constraints.

When there is no prerequisite, teachers, parents and students can consider a course level that was not teacher recommended. For example, if a student is recommended for CP, but prefers an Honors course, the student may go to Honors as long as a prerequisite or grade level does not restrict them.

If your student has a specific goal in mind, then work with the school counselor to select courses that help students reach that goal. The old adage "begin with the end in mind" is helpful.

Be mindful that teenagers change their thought process and plans all the time, and it is common for students to be unsure about post secondary plans. Your budding engineer in ninth grade may decide to go the business route by senior year. It's perfectly fine to explore in high school!

No magical formula exists to ensure entry into a particular college or university, so avoid the temptation to craft a perfect scenario. It's good to do your homework and know what basic requirements post secondary institutions require. Your child's counselor can help with this!

My best advice for students: take challenging coursework that still allows balance, the ability to reasonably manage time and pursue a social life and extracurricular interests. Everyone has strengths, and nobody expects students to be perfect in everything they do.

Course Registration: Electives and Alternatives

- Students choose the correct number of electives they need PLUS two alternatives.
- When the course registration window is open, there is no rush to be the first to submit. All students will be loaded into the system at the same time.
- Electives can be replaced with academic coursework (ie "doubling")
 or academic electives, as long as graduation distribution
 requirements are being met.
- Students may apply to Delaware County Technical School in lieu of their electives, beginning in sophomore year.

Course Registration: Electives and Alternatives

- PowerSchool will automatically schedule an alternate elective if the primary selection does not fit into the schedule.
- Students will need to get a recommendation from a teacher in order to double in a core subject. The system does not list all courses as electives.
- If the student tries to choose the same primary and alternate elective, then that course will be flagged as a duplicate, and the alternate is removed as an option.
