# Policy 707 Use of School Facilities

**Purpose:** The buildings and facilities, including athletic fields and other outdoor spaces of the Wallingford Swarthmore School District are financed and maintained by the district's citizens for the primary purpose of housing the educational program of the district. To the extent that it does not interfere with the educational program, the Board believes the schools should be used by the community to further the educational, cultural, civic, social and recreational growth of its citizens.

**Authority:** The Board will provide for the use of school facilities when permission has been requested in writing and has been approved by the Superintendent or designee.

**Fees**: The Superintendent or designee will propose a fee schedule that will recognize distinctions between groups utilizing District facilities based upon status as "Directly School Related," "Non-profit, noncommercial locally affiliated," and "Outside groups," with appropriate definitions of the same. That fee schedule shall not be intended to increase revenue from such use. It will also take into account the need for janitorial, security and other expenses incurred by the District as well as the impact of individual and cumulative use of the facilities. The Board will periodically approve that fee schedule with any necessary modifications. No such modifications will impact on a previously approved use.
