 How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

The School District Implemented a health and safety plan throughout the 2020-2021 school year using mitigation strategies supported by the CDC, PA Department of Health, CHOP Policy Lab, and other health agencies. These strategies were successful in supporting the larger public health initiative to slow the spread of COVID-19 and to protect our District community, especially those at increased risk for severe liness. Further, our District supported vaccination clinics for our teachers and staff and led vaccine clinics for students.

Even though the Order of the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Health Requiring Universal Face Coverings was lifted on June 28, 2021, the District must still follow the Federal Order issued by the CDC in January 2021. This Order requires face coverings for anyone, regardless of vacchation status, being transported on school buses and vans operated by public and private school systems as a means of public transportation.

Our District will continue to review the latest guidance from the CDC, the PA Department of Health, CHOP Policy Lab and other health agencies. This information will assist the District when reviewing our mitigation strategies for effectiveness. The guidance will also be used to revise our health and safety plan as necessary. The chart below provides strategies, policies, and procedures to be used within the District.

Sidewalk Project East Possom Hollow Road

The Sidewalk Project is scheduled to begin on October 11th, this is when the one-way detour will go into effect. The work is scheduled to end mid-December. Please see the link below for more information.

East Possom Hollow ---Sidewalk Project.

The Township will be installing a PennDOT-funded sidewalk on the train-track side of East Possum Hollow Road from Providence Road (Rte. 252) to the Wallingford Train Station. During the project, East Possum Hollow Road will be one-way. Traffic will only be able to travel eastbound from Providence Road towards the train station/Kershaw Road. Traffic on Kershaw will be forced to turn right onto East Possum Hollow Road. We know this detour will be an inconvenience, but there will be many long-term benefits to safety and accessibility. The contractor for the project is Road-Con Inc., and they are planning to begin their work on October 11th. During this time, the one-way detour will go into effect. Traffic will only be able to proceed eastbound towards the train station. This detour will be in effect until early December. The detour will be removed during the winter months, and it may be necessary for it to be reinstalled in the spring for a month or so. The general construction plan is:

- October 11th mid-December: sidewalk, curbing, and stormwater pipe installation. Materials and weather depending, the guiderail may be installed
- March 18th late April: traffic signal adjustments, ADA sidewalk ramps, and guiderail (if not completed in the fall).

This is a PennDOT-funded project through their Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality program, which is meant to improve access to mass transit.
